The work is performed under the general supervision of the County Administrator who sets policy.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title, do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

Audits financial accounts of each department to see if records check with those maintained by the County Administrator's Office;

Points out deficiencies in present methods;

Suggests changes in methods and procedures;

Makes spot checks of agency inventory and cash on hand;

Obtains and makes comparative analyses of monthly operating statements from each department;

Writes instructions for new procedures to be adopted;

Makes special surveys and comparative studies as directed by the County Administrator.

<u>TERISTICS</u>: Good knowledge of modern principles and practices of governmental accounting and auditing; ability to critically evaluate financial and other business records and detect irregularities;
