COMMUNITY HEALTH COORDINATOR

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: This is a professional position responsible primarily for coordinating the health promotion efforts of the Division of Health and Family services. A substantial portion of the incumbent's duties shall include collaborating directly with Department of Public Health Services and responsibility for researching, planning, implementing and evaluating community health initiatives and programs to improve the health and wellness of the community. Work is performed under the supervision of the Commissioner of the Division of Health and Family Services, with wide leeway for using independent judgment in accomplishing objectives.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title, do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

- Coordinate the health promotion activities of the departments within the Sullivan County Division of Health and Family Services;
- Collaborate with community partners and key staff in the Division to support community health Initiatives;
- Develop and implement programs and initiatives that aim to promote health and wellness in the community;
- Assist Public Health Services and other community partners in assessing the needs of the community and planning and prioritizing interventions;
- Research and prepare grant applications in partnership with respective County and community

 Organizations;

Represent the Division and the County at local health promotion and health planning activities;

Serve on assigned project teams and with other organizations as needed;

Manage special projects, programs, and initiatives as assigned;

Build relationships between the Division and other local agencies aiming to improve community

health.

CHARACTERISTICS: Thorough knowledge of public health principles, practices and

administration; good knowledge of community agencies, facilities and services which may be

utilized in accomplishing program objectives; good knowledge of techniques used to assess

community health needs; ability to gather information, evaluate data and make appropriate

inferences; understanding of the interplay of physical, emotional, and social components of

community health; ability to establish good working relationships with others; ability to seek out the

resources needed to implement health initiatives in the community; ability to evaluate the

effectiveness of community health initiatives on improving community health; ability to prepare and

maintain written reports and/or records; and ability to communicate clearly and effectively, both

orally and in writing.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Either:

(A) Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New

York State Board of Regents to grant degree with a Master's Degree or higher in Public

Health (MPH) or a related field, preferably with a concentration in Health Promotion; or

(B) Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New

York State Board of Regents to grant degrees with a Bachelor's Degree in a field described

in (A) above and two (2) years of administrative experience in a health related organization

or government agency that demonstrates that the candidate possesses the knowledge and

skills necessary to perform the duties contained herein.

Note: Related fields include public health nursing health administration, community health

education, or environmental health.
