Spray paints highway motor vehicles and equipment;

Touches up damaged paint on highway motor vehicles and equipment;

Prepares surfaces for painting by applying paint remover, washing, sandblasting, sanding, scraping and taping;

Applies red lead to steel to prevent rusting;

Straightens out minor dents in bodies and fenders of motor vehicles;

Undercoats and applies rust prohibitor;

Assists in a variety of maintenance tasks;

And other related duties.
