Work is performed under supervision of the Director of Parks, Recreation & Beautification. The work is seasonal and includes working weekends and holidays. This work may also include evenings.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title, do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

Participates in training in order to develop interpretive skills and to become familiar with the history of the site;

Recreates the historical life customs by providing demonstrations and through formal and informal interpretive programming;

Dresses in a professional and historically appropriate manner when representing the museum; Interacts with the pubic in a friendly, professional and hospitable manner;

Protects the visitor's experience and historical integrity of the specific work area by keeping it free of any historically inappropriate modern items;

Provides care to buildings, grounds and objects to ensure the security and safety for the museum and its visitors;

Performs other duties as required.
