<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: The work involves responsibility for coordinating and conducting public education programs on the importance of traffic safety, including child passenger safety training and bicycle helmet safety to members of the public. The incumbent conducts the training programs in compliance with federal, state and local traffic safety regulations. The work is performed under general supervision with some latitude for planning and administering the work. The incumbent exercises no supervision.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title, do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

- Plans, develops, implements and evaluates education programs to promote traffic safety by conducting workshops, forums and group discussions in accordance with federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations;
- Conducts training and presentations to educate members of the public about properly choosing and installing a safety seat;
- Conducts training and presentations to educate members of the public about Vehicle And Traffic

 Laws that relate to bicyclists, including the requirement of wearing bicycle helmets;
- May distribute written material and set up and take down audio-visual equipment, such as televisions, VCR's, overhead projectors, slide projectors, etc. that are necessary to conduct the workshop;
- Designs, develops and distributes literature, brochures and advertising for program promotion and community education purposes;

Writes press releases and articles for submission to the local newspaper;

May coordinate a car seat distribution program for income-eligible families in the program area.

York State Board of Regents to grant degrees with a Bachelor's Degree; or

(B) Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New

York State Board of Regents to grant degrees with an Associate's Degree and two (2) years

of work experience involving counseling, explaining or communicating with the adults or

children; or

(C) Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma and four (4)

years of experience as stated in (B) above; or

(D) An equivalent combination of training and experience as indicated in (A), (B) and (C) above.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: Possession of a current certification as a child safety technician or

instructor by the New York State Governor's Traffic Safety Committee.
