This work is performed under the general supervision of the Engineering Supervisor and/or assigned delegate.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title, do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

Drafts layouts of pavement markings and sign locations;

Supervises the proper installation of traffic control devices;

Inspects sites for permit requirements and permit compliance;

Determines proper control or warning sign location;

Maintains an inventory of all signs on county roads and other county facilities;

Conduct surveys;

Maintains an inventory of all county and town roads, and county facility pavements open to the public, including mileage, surface type, condition, width, etc.;

Maintains a file of traffic accidents;

Provides drivers safety training;

Assists in office and field work for roads and facilities.
