WATER TREATMENT PLANT OPERATIONS SUPERVISOR

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: This position involves responsibility for supervising the operation and maintenance of a water treatment plant operated by a municipality. Work is performed under administrative direction. Supervision is exercised over plant operators, plant attendants, and other staff assigned to the facility.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title, do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

Participates in the interviewing and selection of new staff;

Plans work, assigns work schedules and supervises the work of staff assigned to the water treatment plant;

Reviews operating records and logs to identify problems and makes recommendations to correct problems;

Operates pumps, motors, compressors, machinery, and equipment used in connection with the operation of the water treatment facility;

Provides training and direction to operators, attendants, and other staff assigned to the facility;

Conducts inspections of machinery and equipment to determine that everything is functioning properly;

Conducts chemical tests and periodic analysis of water samples;

Orders supplies and makes recommendations with respect to equipment purchases;

Maintains a variety of records, logs, and reports relating to operation of the water treatment plant;

Meets with engineers, the administrative board of the municipality, or others, to discuss unique

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problems or situations that arise in connection with water treatment operations.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES, AND PERSONAL CHARAC-

TERISTICS: Thorough knowledge of the principles, practices, tools and equipment used in the

operation of the specific type of water treatment plant being supervised; good knowledge of the

principles and applications of physics, chemistry, and bacteriology as applied to water treatment

operations; skill in the operation and repair of pumps, valves, and mechanical/electrical equipment;

ability to plan and supervise the work of others; ability to present ideas clearly both orally and in

writing; ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions; ability to understand and

record data from gauges, scales, and meters; and mechanical aptitude.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Graduation from high school or possession of an equivalency

diploma and three (3) years of experience in the operation of water treatment plant facilities.
